This includes public education relating to drug disposal and social access; stigma reduction; support for those in treatment recovery; and training and educational resources for students, families, and schools. Additionally, the council focuses on preventing overdose deaths by increasing availability and distribution of naloxone and collaborating community-based partners to promote peer support services, treatment referrals and connections to care that reduces recidivism or reoccurrence.

A one-year reflection report will be requested and required by Obion County to evaluate the plan effectiveness. Entities in receipt of Opioid Settlement funds will be subject to audit by Obion County Government and the Tennessee Comptroller's office. Misappropriation of any funds will result in repayment of any and/or all funds to Obion County Government.
